



# Section 5: Next Steps

## Final Considerations

### Tracking

As a reminder, it is important that all student information is captured once they have finished submitting their college applications.

- Students can enter their data directly into the web form with volunteer supervision (preferred) OR they can complete a paper tracker and a volunteer can enter the information into the web form.
- We use this information to track the number of students assisted and number of applications submitted, as well as provide identifying information to the NH Department of Education in determining college enrolment.

When all students have completed their tracker, please alert Granite Edvance. We will run your school's report and let you know how many students completed college applications and the total amount submitted. Please share and celebrate these results with your school community!

### Scholarship

Public, non-charter schools have access to a \$500 scholarship, funded by the NH DOE, Granite Edvance, and several other partners. These schools can decide which senior will receive the scholarship. Your recipient must participate in your school's event and submit at least one college application.

- You may want to place all the participants' names in a hat and draw a winner, or choose your winner directly based on your own criteria. How and when you announce the winner is at your discretion.
- Utilize the scholarship certificate ([Appendix 15](#)) to celebrate your winner.
- It is critical that your site team complete the **Scholarship Recipient Info Form** ([Appendix 21](#)) and sends it back to us so we may accurately process the funds transfer.
- The funds will be held by Granite Edvance until the student has selected their college or university in the spring. After that, **we will mail the scholarship check directly to the student**, with the student and their college as the recipients. Students will also receive instructions on how to deliver the funds to their college, including a cover letter for the student to provide to the school.

## Data Verification

New Hampshire college admissions offices are encouraged to follow up with students that applied to their school during this initiative. Student names and high schools will be provided to each college so they may do so. If the colleges do reach out to these students, it is a great opportunity for them to connect with an admissions officer and have another point of contact in this process.

## Event evaluation

- After your **ApplyNH** event, your site team should meet to discuss the successes and challenges of the current year's initiative – feel free to use the topics from the site team section to guide the discussion. The debrief meeting should occur as close to the conclusion of your **ApplyNH** event as possible. By quickly assessing what worked and what areas need improvement, your site team can get a jump-start on planning for next year's program.
- During this meeting, you can also create an action plan to follow-up with participating students who need to complete their college application(s) or other forms and begin the financial aid application(s). Remember, Granite Edvance is here to help with all next steps, including the critical step of applying for financial aid!

## Post-Event Activities: Keep the Momentum Going

It is important to ensure that students complete their college and other pathway applications by submitting other materials institutions may require, such as high school transcripts, college entrance exam scores, recommendation letters, and **applying for financial aid**. In addition, students should be encouraged to submit additional applications they may not have had time to complete during the event.

## Financial Aid Night

While completing a college application is the first step on the road to college attendance, submitting financial aid information is just as important. In an effort to reach as many of your students and families as possible with this essential information, please schedule and promote NHHEAF's Financial Aid Night for your school.

## Promote FAFSA Completion

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is a federal form that is required for almost all forms of financial aid, including institutional aid and many merit-based scholarships. Help students unlock all their financial aid options by promoting the FAFSA.
